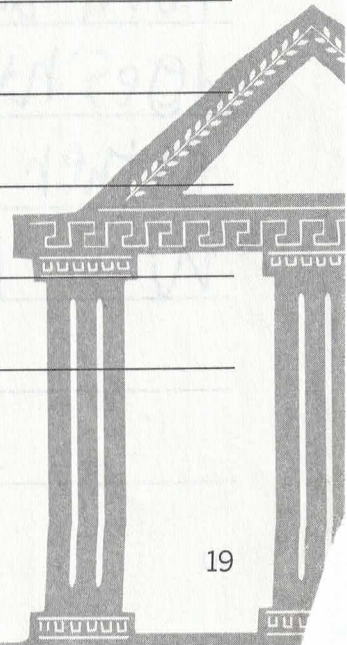

Reading Response: "The Spirit of the Renaissance"

Respond to the following prompt in five to seven sentences. Include two or more pieces of evidence in your response. You may use Activity Page 3.2 for support.

How is the spirit of the Renaissance represented in Leonardo da Vinci's ideas and accomplishments?

Since "The Spirit of the Renaissance" means "The era of new ideas" Leonardo da Vinci's ideas and accomplishments represent this phrase. Leonardo's ideas for a flying machine and mechanical wings were new ideas at the time, and even though they didn't work when he built them, they greatly helped us build machines like the helicopter today. He also designed new weapons for Milan's military, like the armored cart. Leonardo also used new rules like perspective in his paintings. All of these ideas all represent "The era of new ideas" and therefore represent "The Spirit of the Renaissance".
